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# NOTIFICATION OF AWARD FOR GRANTS TO SUCCESSFUL COMMON INTEREST GROUPS (CIGs) AFTER THE 4<sup>TH</sup> CALL FOR PROPOSALS--2<sup>ND</sup> AND FINAL BATCH -KIRINYAGA COUNTY

#### a) Background

Upper Tana Catchment Natural Resources Management Project is a ten year (2012-2022) project funded by Government of Kenya, International Fund for Agricultural Development (IFAD), Spanish Trust Fund and the Local community. The **goal** of the project is to "contribute to reduction of rural poverty in the Upper Tana river catchment". This goal is pursued via two development objectives which reflect the poverty-environment nexus namely (i) increased sustainable food production and incomes for poor rural households living in the project area; and (ii) sustainable management of natural resources for provision of environmental services.

The project is being implemented in six (6) Counties namely: Meru, Tharaka Nithi, Embu, Kirinyaga, Muranga and Nyeri along 24 **river basins** and the tributaries of the four (4) rivers formerly under MKEPP that drain into the Tana River as follows;

Implementation of the project is through four components namely: Community Empowerment, Sustainable Rural Livelihoods, Sustainable Water Resources and Natural Resources Management, and Project Coordination and Management.

### b) Award of Matching Grants to Common Interest Groups (CIGs)-2<sup>nd</sup> and final Batch under 4<sup>th</sup> Call)

The Common Interest Groups (CIGs) submitted proposals during the 4<sup>th</sup> Call to the project and after a rigorous desk and field appraisal, review and approval by both the Project Steering Committee and IFAD, some groups qualified for the award of the Matching Grants. Due to limitation of funds a first batch of successful groups was funded. Following additional funding to the UTANRM Project the other final batch of 120 groups has been approved for funding.

### **3** Grants conditions

- a) Before release of 1<sup>st</sup> tranche of funds, the successful CIG are requested to meet the following conditions as specified in the Matching Grants Manual;
- i. Must sign an Implementation Agreement between the CIGs and UTaNRMP;
- ii. Provide community cash contribution (3 or10%) and materials and labour (7 or 20%) or a combination of both depending on the group/activity category as specified in the Matching Grants Manual;
- iii. Open **designated bank account** in reputable commercial bank in liaison with sub county SDOs.
- iv. Form **three sub-committees** i.e. finance, procurement and monitoring and evaluation
- v. The group members will be required to undergo training organised by the UTaNRMP on finance, procurement and governance;

### b) During implementation

- i. The groups will be required to fully meet the balance of their community contribution depending on the group/activity category
- ii. The groups will be required to implement soil and water conservation measures in all the farms of the group members.
